

Another great showing as POET hosted their 2nd annual *POET Tree* Arbor Day events. The *POET Tree* program is a chance to give back in POET communities by planting more trees, with the helping hands of kids from local schools. Students, usually 4th and 5th graders, get the opportunity to go visit an ethanol plant and learn about the environment and how ethanol impacts our everyday lives. Not only do they get to plant a tree on-site, but they also get to take a little seedling home to plant in their own backyards.

This year, POET also partnered with South Dakota Road Trip, an educational program aimed at teaching 4th graders in S.D. more about their state. Each 4th grader that signed up for South Dakota Road Trip received a seedling to take home to plant – totaling 5,000 trees!

Overall, about 6,325 trees were planted between the two programs. By planting *POET Trees*, students have a constant reminder that they can make a difference in the world and help improve our environment – one tree at a time.
